

Heroes 2:: Cutting Through the Fog:: Andy Stanley

Introduction

Having trouble seeing clearly? Uncertain about what is right and wrong, what to do, and what to think about certain issues you are facing? Do you long for the clarity and confidence to do what needs to be done? One of the distinguishing characteristics of heroes is that they see clearly, and the clarity they have brings urgency to their actions. We'll explore the parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10 to illustrate the clarity that Jesus had.

- 3. How does the culture we live in affect our clarity?
- 4. What is the relationship between clarity and urgency?
- 5. Read Luke 10:25-37. Can you identify with the priest and the Levite? When have you talked yourself out of doing the right thing?
- 6. Can you identify with the Samaritan? When have you seen clearly what needed to be done and acted?
- 7. Where was the expert in the law unclear?
- 8. Where in your life do you need clarity?

Where in your life have you lost clarity? What has made what used to be clear appear to be very complicated?
