INTRODUCTION

Scripture challenges us to look at our money differently because our lives are better when we place our trust in the One who richly provides. DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Reflect back on this Be Rich season. What did you enjoy? What made a big impression on you?
2. How were you challenged during Be Rich this year? How did it change how you view your wealth?
3. Read 1 Timothy 6:19. Talk about creating "a firm foundation for the coming age" with your generosity. Does that idea resonate with you? Why or why not?
4. Read Luke 12:13-21. In the parable, Jesus draws a connection between being rich toward those in need and being rich toward God. Talk about this idea. What do you like about it? How does it challenge you?
5. In the message, Andy says that we don't get credit for what we leave, but for what we give. What's your response to that idea?
6. What is one thing you can do this week to begin viewing wealth through the lens of eternity? What can this group do to support you?
