INTRODUCTION

- 4. Read Revelation 22:20, the last recorded words of Jesus in the Bible. Jesus is coming again to the earth, but when he comes again it will be to initiate the end of the world as we know it. How can we maintain a sense of urgency in pursuing the mission we have been called to?
- 5. Read Acts 1:6-8. In light of the return of Jesus and the mission we are called to, what is your next step in getting on board with the mission?

Read Revelation 7:9-17. Reflect on what heaven will look like. Imagine all the people...from every tribe, tongue and nation. Think about the great celebration that will take place. Write down the emotions you will feel, seeing people there that you were able to invite to the party.
