INTRODUCTION

More Americans than ever are backing away from religion . . . and God. Not because atheism is attractive, but because religion is unattractive. Religion is seen as the problem. It's thought of as a source of conflict and violence. So, it's worth asking the question: *Who Needs God?*

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Have you read books like, *The God Delusion*, *God is Not Great*, and *The End of Faith*? Why or why not? If you have, what did you learn from the experience?
2. Do you agree that religion creates conflict and violence in the world? Explain.
3. During the message, Andy said, "*Atheism and Christianity have this in common: people embrace both before they know what they're getting into.*" Do you agree with that statement? Why or why not?
4. Do you agree that natural selection and the origin of life are different, and that natural selection is not incompatible with faith? Why or why not?
5. During the message, Andy said, "*People who were nothing like Jesus, liked Jesus. If Christianity isn't compelling, it's because we have the wrong version.*" In what ways do you think Jesus would treat atheists differently than the way most modern American Christians treat atheists?
6. Have you ever found yourself asking the question, "*Who needs God?*" Are you asking that question now? If so, what prompted you to ask that question. What did you do or are you doing to seek an answer?

MOVING FORWARD

If you don't believe in God or are on the verge of giving up on God, it's probably not because of a thoroughly researched rational conclusion. It's probably more personal than that. Atheism hasn't become more appealing. Your version of theism lost its appeal or doesn't seem real. Stick around in the weeks to come as we continue to explore the question, *Who needs God?*
